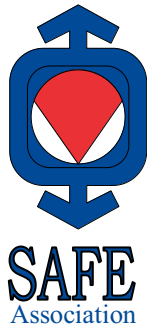

- Extensive or elaborate justification is not necessary.
- The deadline for submittal of nominations is **close of business (West Coast Time) Friday, August 20th**.
