RAF COMPLETES RED 6 AUGMENTED REALITY TRIAL ABOARD HAWK 2

The UK Royal Air Force (RAF) has completed a series of flight trials using Advanced Tactical Augmented Reality Systems (ATARS) technology developed by Red 6. The activity was performed using a BAE Systems Hawk T2 advanced jet trainer operating from the service's Valley base on Anglesey, North Wales.

"Supported by Red 6 staff, pilots were immersed in scenarios to assess the viability of augmented reality technology," says the RAF, which is exploring the potential of such equipment for use as part of its future flight training system.

"ATARS enables pilots to identify, engage and defeat virtual adversaries programmed to act and react as a pilot would experience in hostile combat, and cooperate with synthetic support aircraft whilst airborne," the RAF says.

The service says it is exploring whether technology such as ATARS could enable it to "improve training quality, increase throughput and lower essential overheads like aircraft, airspace and instructors".

Plans for the trial activity were announced in July 2024, with BAE acting as prime contractor for the work.



One-on-One with Teresa Ferraro

President and CEO of East/West Industries, Inc.

We speak with Teresa Ferraro to learn more about the history of this womanowned small business, what enables their success, and where the company is heading.

Questions:

SAFE News

1: East/West has been in business for nearly 60 years can you tell us something of the company's origins and how it came to the helicopter seat market?

East/West began as small business on Long Island, NY, started by my parents Mary and Dom Spinosa in 1968. It was in our dining room that my father began designing and developing small oxygen components for fixed wing aircraft. He was a true visionary and an extraordinary engineer. Over the next 5 decades, East/West grew from 5 employees producing small aircraft components in the dining room, to more than 80 employees producing seating systems and complex aircraft components in a 75,000 sq. ft. facility. With a team of talented design engineers, management and support personnel that we call family, East/West is celebrating the legacy that my parents started.





2: As a relatively small and family-owned business, East/West has been competing successfully with some of the biggest names in the business. How does the company accomplish this? What are the essential qualities that enable you to succeed in such a competitive market?

East/West takes pride in delivering first class support to our customers. We are a small, agile team, providing us the flexibility as a solutions provider to fulfil the needs of our customers quickly and effectively. East/West has continuously invested in state-of-the-art technologies like 3D printing, Laser and Optical Scanning, and developed strategic partnerships to support higher end capabilities like digital twin modelling and simulation. Our facility houses all functions of the business, from R&D to manufacturing, resulting in a flat communication structure that expedites our response time when addressing the priorities of our customers and end users. 3: Let's talk about your products. A good crashworthy performance implies weight, generally speaking, yet you manage to keep the overall weight of your products down what can you tell us about how you make that possible?

Our journey into crash attenuating seating systems started nearly 30 years ago with the patenting of our first energy attenuation system in 1998. Over the years, we have refined our understanding of human dynamics in aviation crash sequences, leading to advancements in our crash attenuating systems. The basis of our crashworthy seats is our patented attenuation system which offers very high levels of performance and adaptability while also being extremely lightweight. By using this system across many of our designs are able to maintain high performance while not adding weight. We are dedicated to constantly refining our attenuation technology and the materials we use to provide the lightest, strongest seats on the market.

4: Weight and protection seem a winning combination; what civil and defense programs have you been working on? (with this one if you could focus on B505, and FLRAA with a dash of CH-53)

Through our track record as a supplier to multiple OEMs, we have developed a strong reputation as a reliable industry partner. Sikorsky selected our team to produce Crashworthy Troop Seats for the CH-53K, a major program for us that is now maturing to full-rate production. Most recently, we were selected by Bell to develop and manufacture Troop and Gunner Seats for the Army's Future Long Range Assault Aircraft (FLRAA). Selection for this program is a true milestone in the history of our organization, and we are proud to play a key role in developing the rotorcraft of the future. Additionally, we continue to support the Bell 505 program with Crashworthy Utility and VIP Seats, bringing our crash attenuation technology and lightweight seating systems to the civil market.

5: With the potential of 465 aircraft, the CH-47F block II program looks to be an enticing project what can you tell us about your involvement with this program?

Since 2005, we have been steadfast supporters of Team Chinook and the CH-47 program, starting with development of our CH-47 Crashworthy Crew Chief Seat.. We have implemented additional design upgrades to the CCCS over the years, while also developing the Cargo Ramp Gunner Seat (CRGS) and, most recently, the Improved Troop Seat (ITS). The Improved Troop Seat is the first major upgrade to the CH-47 troop seating system in nearly 60 years, and we are proud to be produce a modular system that is safer, stronger, and more comfortable for Chinook operators worldwide. We are committed to the Chinook and look forward to supporting the program for years to come.
